


What is a Parks and Recreation Plan?




- Provides an assessment of current conditions
- Inspired by Public Engagement, which details how Amherst Citizens want their parks and programs
- Provides insight and direction for future public expendature decisions – park infrastructure, sports, lifetime activities, programs, public services
- <u>Timeframe is 10-20 years</u> with priorities for immediate, mid-range and long-range programs and development
- <u>Used as a guide</u> by public officials, citizens, clubs, and public entities




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Project Tasks Timeline
