

Shots Fired Call Data

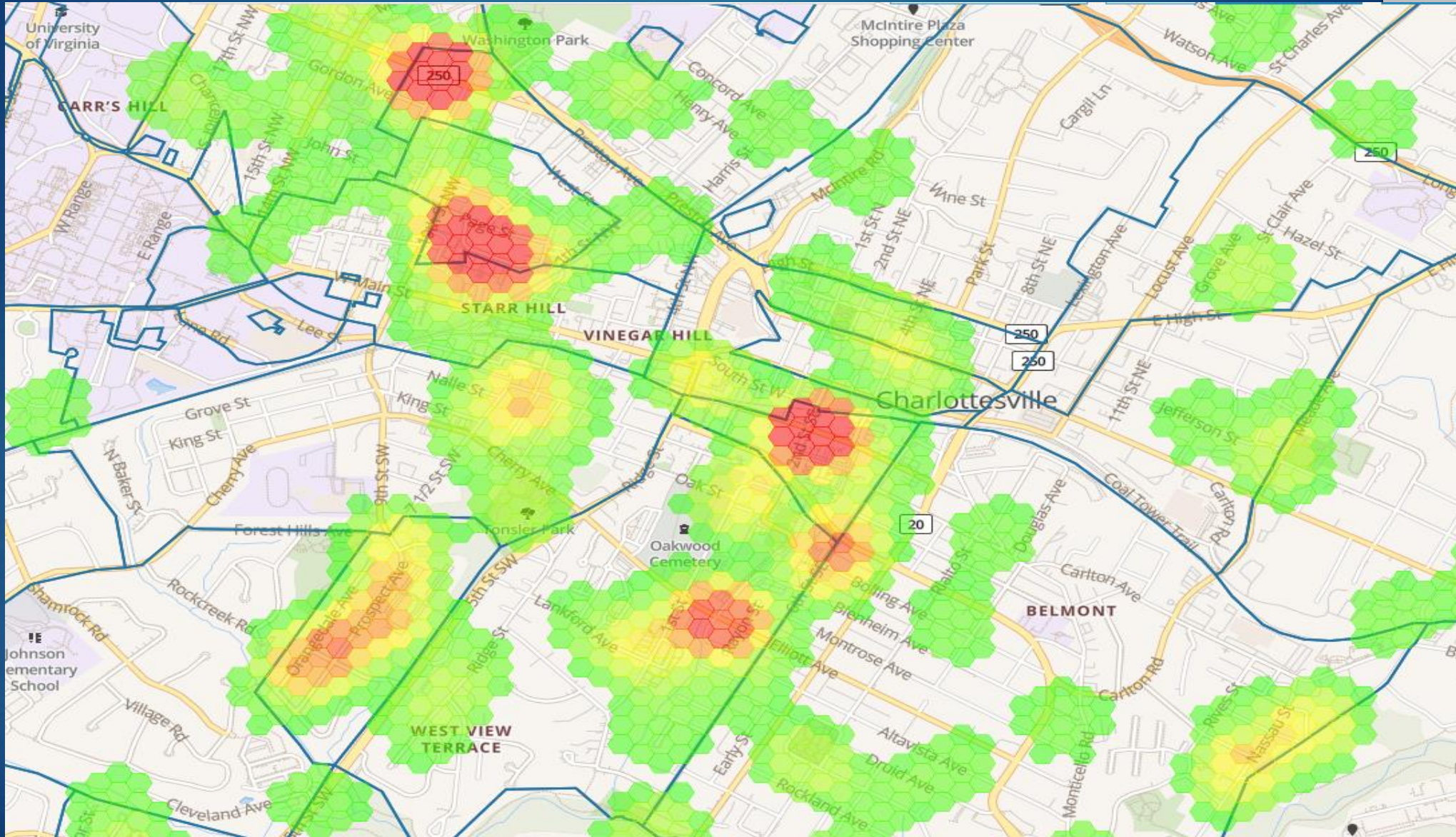
Due to the growing concerns regarding shots fired calls within the city, CPD has compiled the following numbers to better understand the effect that these calls have throughout the city. These raw numbers captured below are the responses since 2017.

- ❖ These numbers do not separate the cases by injury, death, or confirmed by evidence, only that we responded to the call for service:
 - 2017 - 185
 - 2018 - 181
 - 2019 - 172
 - 2020 - 298
 - 2021 - 322
 - 2022 - 211 (as of 10/23)

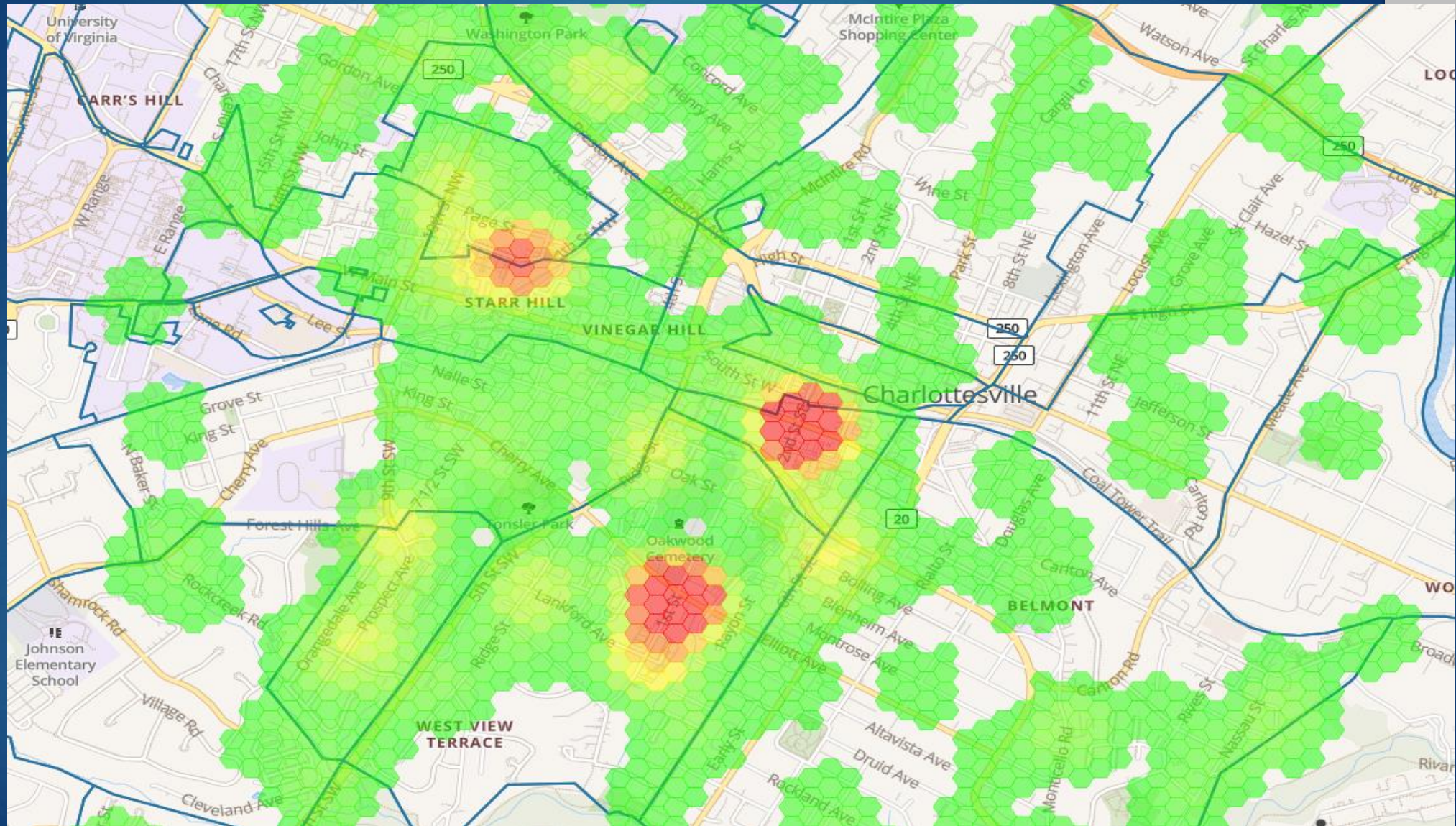


- ▶ The following maps illustrate the most impacted communities over the last four (4) years.

- ▶ 2022 - 211 (as of 10/23)

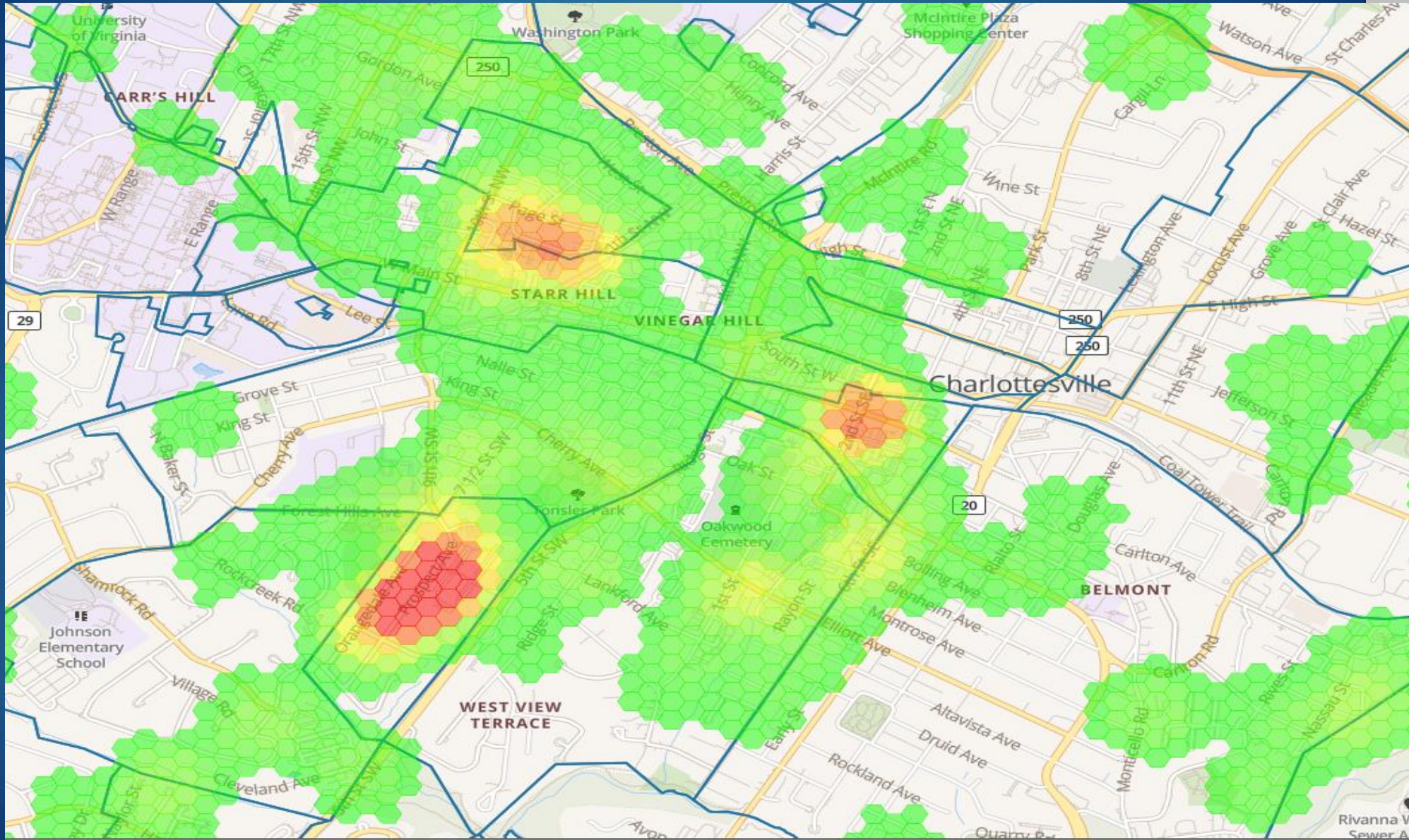

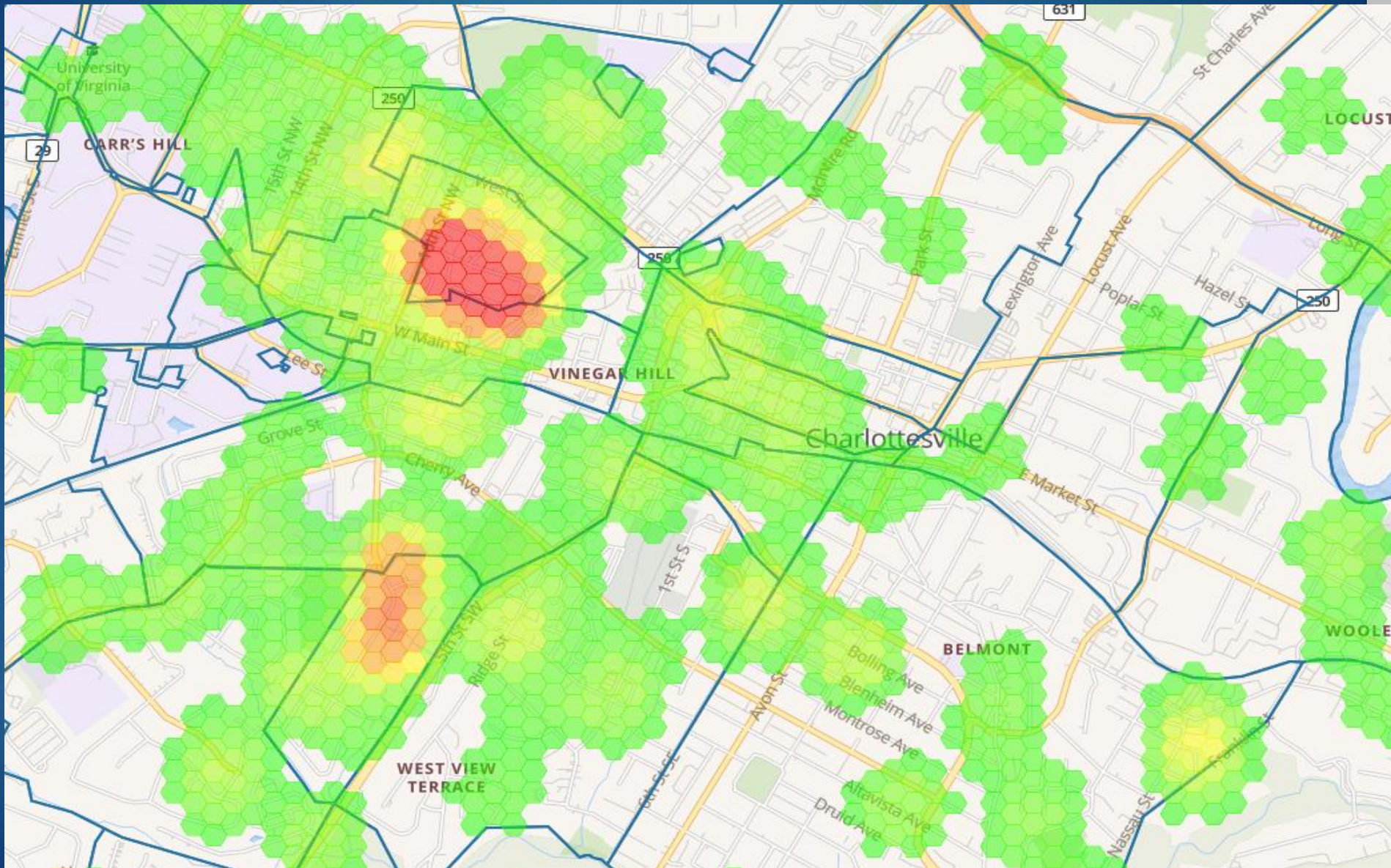

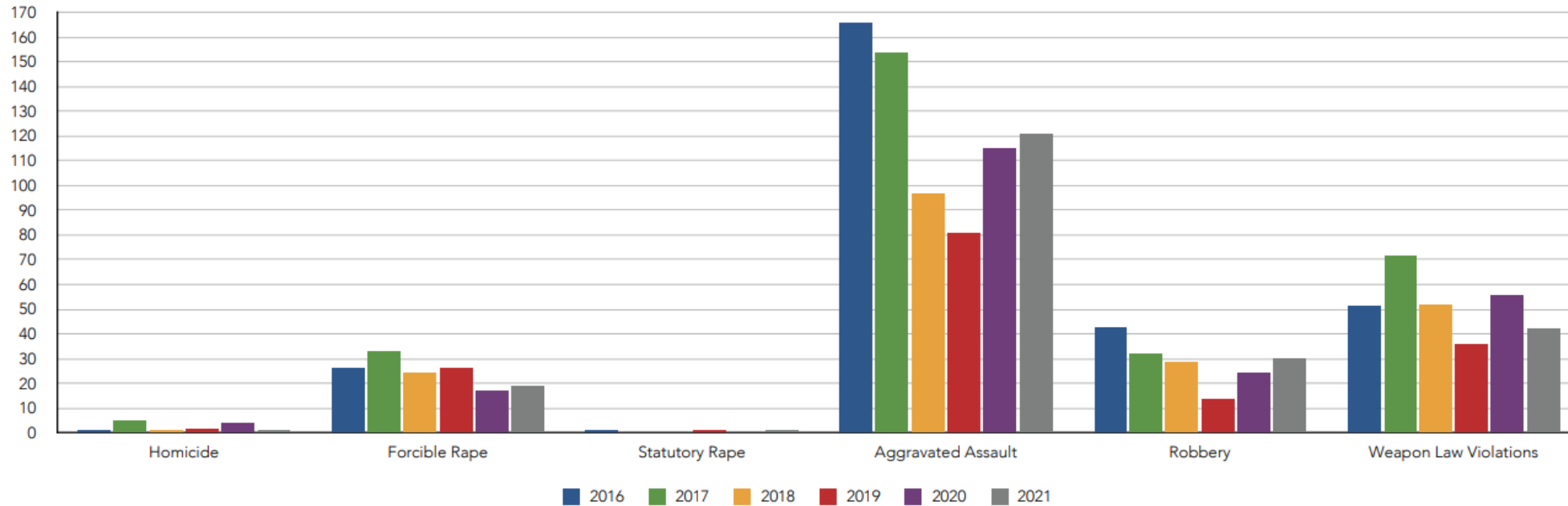

- ▶ (a) Color in table denotes the following: highest number of annual offenses within the denoted date range = **red**; lowest number of annual offenses within the denoted date range = **green**.
- ▶ (b) There is no low offense noted in the “Homicide” row as there were three years where one (1) homicide was reported [2016, 2018, 2021].
- ▶ (c) There is no low or high number offense noted in the “Statutory Rape” row as there was one (1) offense reported in 2016, 2019, and 2021 - so there is not a single high nor single low.
- ▶ (d) Information for this table was collected from publicly available CPD annual reports, located on the CPD webpage. Data points do change from report to report due to collaborations with Virginia State Police that refined data
