A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR AND CITY CLERK TO ENTER INTO A CONSTRUCTION CONTRACT WITH MID-CONTINENTAL RESTORATION CO., INC., OF FORT SCOTT, KANSAS; AMENDING THE BUDGET TO APPROPRIATE TWO HUNDRED THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$200,000.00) FROM GENERAL FUND RESERVES TO ACCOUNT #100-01-70157; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

WHEREAS, restoration of the Victory Theater must be performed to assure the safety of the performers and audience;

WHEREAS, Mid-Continental Restoration Co., of Fort Scott, Kansas has estimated the cost of this restoration to be two hundred and twenty-five thousand dollars (\$225,000.00);

WHEREAS, there is carry over money from the 2020 budget that will also fund the restoration; and

WHEREAS, this project will be through a procurement alliance.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ROGERS, ARKANSAS THAT:

Section 1: The Mayor and City Clerk are authorized to enter into a contract with Mid-Continental Restoration Co., Inc., of Fort Scott, Kansas, in an amount not to exceed two hundred twenty-five thousand dollars (\$225,000.00), for restoration of the Victory Theater;

Section 2: The 2021 Budget is hereby amended to appropriate two hundred thousand dollars (\$200,000.00) from General Fund Reserves to Account #100-01-70157;

A RESOLUTION AMENDING THE 2021 BUDGET TO APPROPRIATE FOUR HUNDRED FIFTY THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$450,000.00) FROM GENERAL FUND RESERVES INTO ACCOUNT #100-09-70268 PROFESSIONAL SERVICES FOR CITYWORKS SOFTWARE CONVERSION AND IMPLEMENTATION; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

WHEREAS, the Rogers City Council selected the Timmons Group of Richmond, Virginia to provide integration and implementation services for the conversion from CityView software to Cityworks software;

WHEREAS, Resolution 20-60 allowed the Mayor and City Clerk to enter into a contract with Timmons Group;

WHEREAS, this project sets the foundation for various city departments to utilize software components such as asset management, permitting, collecting alcohol tax, code enforcement, inspections, and licensing; and

WHEREAS, the Timmons Group estimates the cost of this project will not exceed four hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$450,000.00).

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ROGERS, ARKANSAS THAT:

Section 1: The 2021 Budget is amended to appropriate four hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$450,000.00) from General Fund Reserves to Account #100-09-70268 Professional Services;

ORDINANCE NO. 21-_____

**AN ORDINANCE ADOPTING CHANGES TO THE COMPREHENSIVE GROWTH MAP;
PROVIDING FOR THE EMERGENCY CLAUSE; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.**

WHEREAS, on May 4, 2021, the Planning Commission recommended approval of several updates to the Downtown Regional Center Zoning Plan of the Comprehensive Growth Map; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to A.C.A §14-56-423, after adoption of plans, ordinances, and regulations and proper filing in the offices of city clerk and county recorder, amendments to plans, ordinances, or regulations may be made by a majority vote of the city council.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ROGERS, ARKANSAS THAT:

Section 1: Parcel 02-01096-000, located at W. Persimmon and N. 8th streets, is changed to COM on the Downtown Regional Center Zoning Plan;

Section 2: Parcels 02-05222-000, 02-05223-000, 02-05224-000, 02-05225-000, and 02-05226-000, located between W. Pine Street, S. 2nd Street, and the railroad, are changed to NBT on the Downtown Regional Center Zoning Plan;

Section 3: Parcels 02-05733-000, 02-05734-000, 02-05734-002, 02-05734-001, and 02-05735-000, located between W. Oak Street, S. 2nd Street, and the railroad, are changed to NBT on the Downtown Regional Center Zoning Plan;

Section 4: Parcels 02-06749-000, 02-06750-000, 02-06750-001, 02-06751-000, 02-06752-000, 02-05118-000, 02-05101-000, 02-22701-000, 02-02911-000, 02-02910-000, and all parcels between E. Pine Street, S. Arkansas Street, S. Monte Ne Road, E. Oak Street, and the Railyard Bike Park, are changed to NBT on the Downtown Regional Center Zoning Plan;

Section 5: Emergency Clause: The need to adopt these changes is immediate in order to protect the public peace, health, safety, and welfare an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from the date of passage and approval;

ORDINANCE NO. 21-_____

**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ROGERS CODE SECTION 14-675 BY RE-ZONING
CERTAIN LANDS FROM A-1 TO U-COM AND U-NBT, PROVIDING FOR
THE EMERGENCY CLAUSE AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES**

WHEREAS, pursuant to the provisions of Rogers Code Section Rogers Code Section 14-725, et seq, and upon the consideration of the report and recommendations of the Planning Commission of the City of Rogers, Benton County, Arkansas, on June 1, 2021, the City Council has found that certain lands hereinafter described are better suited for U-COM and U-NBT zoning.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ROGERS, ARKANSAS:

SECTION 1: That Section 14-675 of the Code of Ordinances, City of Rogers, should be and the same hereby is amended as hereinafter provided.

SECTION 4: Emergency Clause. That it is necessary to bring proposed uses of the property into conformance with the Rogers City Zoning Ordinances and because of such an emergency is declared to exist and in order to protect the public peace, health, safety and welfare, this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from the date of its passage and approval.

SECTION 5: Severability Provision. In the event that any section, paragraph, subdivision, clause, phrase, or other provision or portion of this Ordinance shall be adjudged invalid or unconstitutional, the same shall not affect the validity of this Ordinance as a whole, or any part or provision, other than the part so decided to be invalid or unconstitutional, and the remaining provisions of this Ordinance shall be construed as if such invalid, unenforceable or unconstitutional provision or provisions had never been contained herein.

SECTION 6: Repeal of Conflicting Ordinances and Resolutions. All ordinances, resolutions or orders of the City Council, or parts of ordinances, resolutions or orders of the City Council in conflict herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.
