ORDINANCE NO. 58-2023

TO AUTHORIZE THE CITY MANAGER TO ENTER INTO CONTRACT WITH MARKER CONSTRUCTION FOR THE RENOVATION OF THE SERVICE BUILDING AND TENNIS COMPLEX AT NORTHAM PARK

WHEREAS,	in response to the 2018 Parks & Recreation Comprehensive Plan,
	related to Northam Park and the Tennis Complex, the Northam Park
	Vision Plan was created in 2020, followed by a Master Drainage Plan
	in 2021; and

WHEREAS,	the first phase of improvements was constructed in 2022 with the
	installation of a new storm line and below grade stormwater detention,
	followed by a renovation of the West Athletic Fields in 2023; and

WHEREAS,	the next phase of improvements will focus on the north end of the park,
	which includes a renovation of the service building, tennis complex, and
	adjacent park areas; and

WHEREAS,	the scope of work included in the project was originally planned to be
	implemented over two phases, with the first phase being bid in August
	2022, but at that time the first phase included the replacement of the
	service building and the renovation of three clay courts; and

WHEREAS,	despite efforts to contain costs through refinements in the project
	scope, bids exceeded estimates by 17%, due to market conditions, and
	as a result, it was determined that the work should be postponed and
	revisited at a later date; and

WHEREAS,	in 2023, staff continued to study the needs for improvements Northam Park, working with design consultants OHM Advisors						
	recreation consultant Ballard King to determine the scope of						
	improvements that could be accommodated within the approved						
	budget; and						

WHEREAS,	the findings of these additional studies were presented to City Council
	and the Park and Recreation Advisory Board (PRAB) in May 2023, with
	additional public outreach conducted throughout the summer; and

WHEREAS,	on October 27, 2023, the City received the following bids for renovations
	of the Northam Park Service Building and Tennis Complex; and

WHEREAS, Marker Construction's bid was reviewed by City staff and OHM Advisors,

and has been determined to be responsive for an amount of \$2,966,528,

with a 10% contingency of \$296,653; and

WHEREAS, staff recommends accepting bid alternates one through five and requests

approval for underground irrigation at the clay tennis courts, requiring authorization for an additional \$517,262 above the project bid, but within the project budget, as underground irrigation was not included in the bid

process; and

WHEREAS, the underground irrigation would improve playing conditions, reduce

downtime due to watering, and reduce staffing needs at the Tennis

Complex.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Upper Arlington, Ohio:

SECTION 1. The City Manager is hereby authorized to enter into contract with

Marker Construction for the renovation of the Service Building and Tennis Complex at Northam Park, for an amount not to exceed \$3,780,443, which includes accepting the base bid with a 10 percent contingency, bid alternates one through five, and addition of a subgrade

irrigation system.

SECTION 2. The provisions in Chapter 138 – Procurement Code of the Code of

Ordinances of the City of Upper Arlington are hereby waived for the

subgrade irrigation portion of the project.

SECTION 3. The City Manager, Finance Director, and the City Attorney are hereby

authorized to take all actions, including the execution of all documents or amendments necessary to enter into, implement, and administer the agreement, that are not substantially inconsistent with this ordinance.

SECTION 4. This ordinance shall take effect immediately upon passage.
